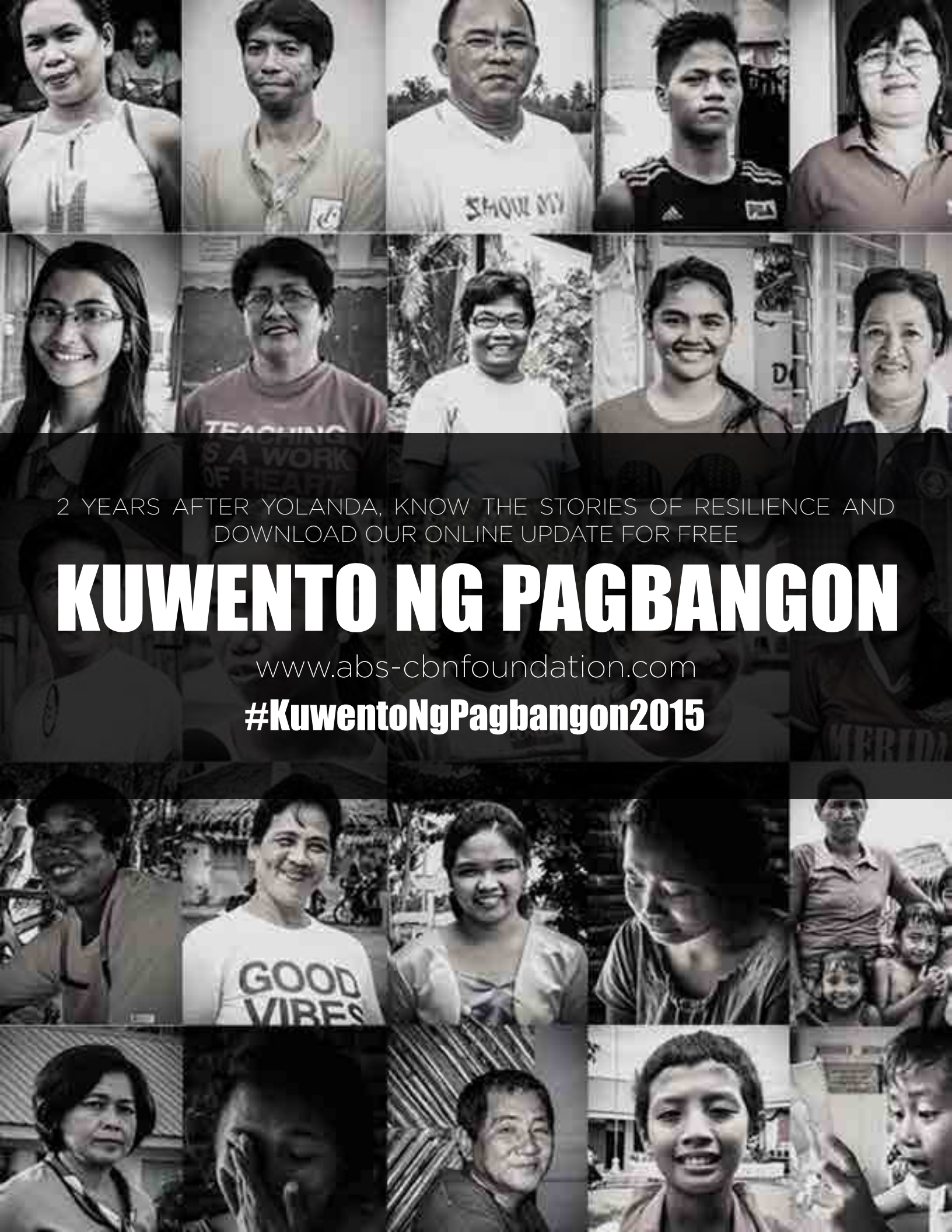

PNB Launches YES Ph

THE YOUNG AND EMPOWERED STUDENTS OF THE PHILIPPINES WAS LAUNCHED IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ALKFI

40 student leaders from different parts of the country, together with 42 teachers, and 24 branch managers from Philippine National Bank, joined a three-day financial literacy training headed by PNB and ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc. The campaign dubbed as the Young and Empowered Students of the Philippines (YES PH) has officially opened last November 26 - 28, 2015



Housed at Hive Hotel in Quezon City for three days, participants were able to learn different tips and strategies on how to save money; and more importantly, how to invest. They underwent various leadership workshops and financial responsibility trainings from subject matter experts.

During the first day, aside from orientation and a discussion with Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas, attendees had a special trip to Philippine Stock Exchange to know how stock exchange works and how it influences investment choices. The last two days were all about trainings and discussion about the campaign.

The YES Ph Campaign will go through three phases in a year's duration. After the training, the participants are expected to be the ambassadors for the campaign in their respective schools and communities to inspire others. Janette Abad Santos, the Vice President for Marketing of PNB told the students, "Imagine what your one effort of teaching others will do for the country someday if everybody knew how to handle money. That's the purpose of financial literacy. It's not just about you but it's about spreading that attitude, that culture, of handling money well."

Participating student leaders and teachers got a specially designed ATM card with an opening amount worth PhP1,000.00

The second phase of the Campaign will be a competition between schools where students are challenged to regularly save on their PNB accounts.

The competition will commence with an awarding ceremony. Three winners will be chosen: the school with the most number of newly opened accounts; the student from the winning school who has the biggest savings; and the student among all the participating schools who has the biggest deposit during the competition period of December 2015 - March 2016.

ABS-CBN SUCCESSFULLY HELD CHRISTMAS GIFT-GIVING TO 1,000 TYPHOON-STRICKEN FAMILIES

A total of 1000 families who have been affected by typhoon Lando in Palayan City, Nueva Ecija were given Christmas gift packs at the Thank You For The Love Gift-giving outreach activity led by the ABS-CBN Executive Committee last December 4 at Plaza Concepcion in Palayan City.

Typhoon Lando lashed the Philippines October 2015, bringing winds of up to 185 kilometers per hour (kph) and gustiness of up to 220 kph.

The Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JWTC); which uses a different standard than that of PAGASA, classified "Lando" as a super-typhoon.

It made landfall in northern Luzon, severely affecting the provinces such as Aurora, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya and Nueva Ecija.

The beneficiaries specifically came from Barangays Betania, Laur, Calabasa and Gabaldon.

Head of Integrated News and Current Affairs Ging Reyes shared why ABS-CBN chose to conduct the gift-giving outreach activity for these barangays. "The real reason we chose these barangays and this area, well, the other areas that were really devastated by Lando were served by Sagip Kapamilya ably so itong mga families na

'to ang mga kulang pa kaya sila napili na mabigyan ngayon ng tulong, mabigyan ng mga Christmas gift packs. 'Yun 'yung mga underserved families in their particular barangays. The other families who were also masasabi natin gravely affected by the typhoon, were ably served and assisted by our foundation kaya ito 'yung kumbaga, para makumpleto natin 'yung mga dapat bigyan ng tulong sa lugar," she said.

Recalling how the typhoon has badly affected the area, one of the city's barangay captains, Julius De Leon of Barangay Caimito said, "Yung pong baha na dumating dito sa lungsod ng Palayan ay sinasabi po ng mga matatanda na 1936 lang nila nakita. So noong pong panahon na 'yun, ngayon lang po 'yun naulit, ganon po kalaki 'yung tubig." When asked how high did the flood reach, he answered, "Mahirap pong sabihin kung gaano kataas dahil talagang napakataas," and even pointed at the roof of their covered court.

Likewise, resident Victorina Gante lamented at how the typhoon took away their livelihood. "Biglaan pong rumagasa ang tubig kaya wala ho kaming nagawa kung hindi lumikas po sa mas mataas na bahay. Lahat po ng kabuhayan namin, nabasa po pati pananim namin, na-washed out po kaya naranasan din po naming hindi kumain," she said and added that her



bigger problem now is how to start with their farming anew saying that their livelihood is very important for them. "Binhi man lang, malaking bagay na po sa'min 'yun," she said.

Aside from the breakfast and packed lunches, the beneficiaries received Christmas gift packs that included a Noche Buena package and a Sagip Kapamilya bag. Identified students also received school kits while identified farmers were given cans of seedlings. Some of our kababayans also took home raffle and game prizes such as ABS-CBN TV Plus black boxes and ABS-CBN items.

Aside from Ging Reyes, also present in the gift-giving activity were ABS-CBN Chairman Gabby Lopez, Channel Head Cory Vidanes and Chief Operating Officer Carlo Katigbak, among others.

NEWLY-BUILT MODERN SCHOOL BUILDING TURNED
OVER BY SAGIP KAPAMILYA IN BULACAN



Sagip Kapamilya, the emergency humanitarian assistance arm of ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation (ALKFI), recently turned-over the newly-built 4-classroom 2-storey fully furnished school building in Frances Elementary School, Calumpit, Bulacan last September 30, 2015 which was attended by different stakeholders, partners and volunteers from various sectors.

In partnership with Maybank, Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), United Architects of the Philippines (UAP), Department of Education (DepEd), LGU of Calumpit, MARIWASA, Jacinto Roofing, Parents and Teachers Association (PTA) of Frances ES and other kind-hearted volunteers, Sagip Kapamilya started the project and readily ensured its completion and eventual turn-over to the beneficiary school.

"This activity is a celebration of partnership!" said Maybank President and CEO Mr. Herminio Famatigan Jr. in his inspiring speech. "This (building) is our humble contribution to Frances Elementary School and to this community...We are happy to be part of this project."

On the other hand, Brigadier General Henry Sabarre, speaking on behalf of Philippine Army Vice Commander Major General RD Santillan, lauded the functional

design of the building, *"This 4-classroom building can accommodate over 160 students which will surely serve as a proper and efficient learning environment. It has also two comfort rooms, one elevated tank, one cistern tank, and two vertical gardens... Congratulations to everyone who contributed in making this project a fruitful success."* He also affirmed the AFP's commitment to meaningful and pro-community partnership, *"Let us carry on in honing the minds of these children to fulfill the promise of raising competent leaders for brighter generations."*

The new building showcases the innovative architectural talent of UAP architects, the engineering craftsmanship of Army engineers and the unifying factor of the Filipino Bayanihan spirit among the stakeholders which Sagip Kapamilya Program Director Jun Dungo aptly summed up in his speech, *"Kayang-kaya basta sama-sama!"*

Busuanga Villages Receive Nebulizer Units and Generator Sets



Busuanga, Palawan - Local leaders of Busuanga immensely appreciated the 15 nebulizer units and 6 generator sets donated by Sagip Kapamilya for the residents in their villages. *"Ang Sagip Kapamilya ay tunay na aming Kapamilya. Hindi sila nagsasawa na patuloy kaming gabayan sa aming pagbangon"*, said one village leader during the simple turn-over ceremony at the Municipal Legislative Building in the afternoon of September 18, 2015.

The recipient 13 barangays namely: Salvacion, New Busuanga, Old Busuanga, Cheey, Kiwit, Concepcion, Santo Niño, Panlaitan, San Isidro, Quezon, Maglalambay, Sagrada, and San Rafael, were awarded one (1) unit of nebulizer each while barangay Buluang, a remote community in Busuanga, Palawan that has high incidents of respiratory illnesses, was awarded two (2) nebulizers. Also, barangays San Isidro, Santo, Niño, Maglalambay, Bogtong, Buluang and Quezon were also given one (1) generator set each. *"Ilong mga bagong kagamitan na ipinagkaloob ng Sagip Kapamilya ay malaking tulong po ito sa aming taat dito sa Busuanga,"* said Vice Mayor Elizabeth Cervantes who graced the modest activity.

Busuanga is one of the areas that were severely affected by super typhoon Yolanda (International Codename: Haiyan) in November 8, 2013 where ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation (ALKFI) has been continuously conducting different humanitarian interventions which include programs on health, education, and livelihood, for the communities.

Last February 12, 2015, Sagip Kapamilya turned over to DepEd-Busuanga District twenty one (21) newly-built and fully furnished public school classrooms in nine (9) different school sites around the island municipality. The project was another Bayanihan initiative of various stakeholders, like the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Department of Education (DepEd), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and Busuanga PNP Office, helping the community in its rehabilitation efforts after super typhoon Yolanda devastated the island municipality two years ago.

Potable Water for Sitio Caguisikan

Access to potable water is one of the problems in remote areas like Sitio Caguisikan, Brgy. Gutad of Calapan, Oriental Mindoro.

For the past 20 years, families in Sitio Caguisikan have to walk 7 kilometers just to get drinking water for their daily needs.

Recently, Sagip Kapamilya of ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc., turned-over a water facility in Caguisikan Elementary School benefiting 1,482 families. Sagip Kapamilya provided the material and labor for installation.

Caguisikan ES is also a beneficiary of ALKFI-SK's *"Gusto Kong Mag-aral Project"* where they were given two classrooms last July. The classroom buildings were done through Sagip Kapamilya's partnership with Philippine Army 203rd Brigade and Engineering Construction Battalion of Calapan. 145 students also benefited from *"Sagip Kalusugan"*, a feeding program that runs for 120 days.

Central Visayas Scholars' Teambuilding



7 November 2015 - A teambuilding activity was conducted at Bet 'n Choy Farms in Catigbian, Bohol attended by Sagip Kapamilya Scholars across the Visayas region. The program provided capability and capacity building initiated by Banta Bata 163 Cebu. It was a day of activities to meet new friends, expand connections and enrich values. Attendees included the 30 academic scholars who were chosen from the state universities in the Visayas (Cebu Technological University, Negros Oriental State University and Bohol Island State University) back in 2013. It was part of TV Patrol Central Visayas' tie up with Sagip Kapamilya and Bantay Bata 163 for their silver anniversary celebration 2 years ago. The teambuilding activity would not have been possible without the support of its generous donors: LITE Shipping and Monde Nissin.

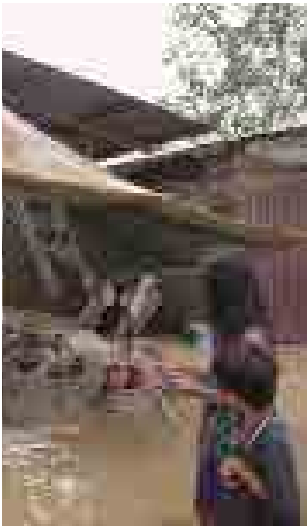

Good Payers Recognized @ BNJ

Lea Nabor, a market vendor and a Typhoon Ondoy survivor, received PhP10,000.00 worth of grocery gift certificates for winning the top prize in the "Araw ng Parangal para sa mga Natalangang Negosyante ng Community Innovation Fund (CIF)." Nabor and 35 others were recognized for making sure no repayments were missed from their CIF loans.

The CIF is an interest-free loan scheme that seeks to support small enterprises in the Southville 7 resettlement project in Calauan, Laguna. The fund is managed by ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Bayan EDGE (Enterprise Developers, Growers and Evolvers), and the BayaniJuan Producers Association. Funded by the Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction (JFPR), the fund has released PhP5.7 million in loans, benefiting almost 600 individuals. Repayments have reached PhP3.1 million, with about 100 CIF borrowers classified as "good payers."

Nabor said maintaining the trust of her clients is key to her business' success. "Ayaw ko po magpaliban dahil ano pinaglalanaan ko po talaga iyon dahil ayaw ko ng masira sa pinag-uulangan ko... para sa akin pag ganitong mahirap lang tayong dignidad na lang ang meron tayong di ba? Kailangan nating pagsumikap na hindi natin hindi tayong masira sa kausap natin." (I don't like to skip my repayments. I make sure to set aside some money for my loan dues. We don't have much in life but our dignity. We need to work hard to gain the trust of our clients).

The awardees were classified into three categories: A, B and C. Under Category A, CIF borrowers should have no past repayment dues as of the 31st of August 2015 cut-off date. They should also have an existing business and reached at least Grant 2 of the loan cycle.

Placing second to Nabor was Maria Deolita Aligado, who received PhP8,000.00 worth of gift certificates. The third prize amounting to PhP7,000.00 worth of gift certificates was given to Evangelina Colar. Round up the Category A winners were: (Top 4-15) Lani Catian, Estela Lopez, Arcellie Lua, Cheryl Constantino, Marcelito Bacason, Mary Grace Endino, Michelle Arnesto, Marilou Combate, Marilyn Zapanta, Mariel Basilan, Filipina Magat, and Victoria Sarol. Felix Mores, Consorcia Rodriguez and Sally Dugos. Those who made it from Top 4-15 received PhP5,000.00 worth of gift certificates while those in Top 16-28 were awarded PhP3,000.00 worth of gift certificates.

Category A winner and peanut butter entrepreneur Estela Lopez is thankful for the additional capital offered through the CIF. "Magpapasalamat din po ako sa pagtulong neto kasi mga yung walang-wala tulungan ko rin po sila. Tapos sa awa ng Diyos po nakakaraos din ako sa...hindi naman ako sa nawawalan ng ano... puhunan. Tapos yung ulang ko nahuhulugan ko rin po tuwing martes hindi ako nakakapalyang maghulog. Sipag lang po na mag-ikot saka tiyaga." (We are grateful for the assistance, which enabled me to also help others in need. By the grace to God, I never run out of money for my business. Also, I'm able to save some for my repayments every Tuesday. Hard work and perseverance are needed to keep the business rolling).

Under Category B, CIF borrowers should have classified as good payers as of 31 July 2015 but incurred repayment dues as of 31 August 2015. However, they were able to update their accounts and maintain good repayment status until the end of September. Category B awardees also reached at least Grant 2 of the loan cycle and maintains an existing business. Those who have recovered past due payments within a week received PhP2,000.00 worth of gift certificates while those who took more than a week to address their repayments got PhP1,000.00 worth of gift certificates. The Category B awardees were: Iris Pascual, Regina Ibarreta, Lyne Jacolbia, Merlita Reoyan, Rolando Morales, Jocelyn Torado, Emily Rivas, and Linoganarao Batua-an (Cayamombos).

Committed to empower women, Uniqlo seals the agreement with ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation to give livelihood to the women of the community in Southville 7 Calauan, Laguna.

Under the partnership are two projects called "Upcycling" and "Recycling". In Upcycling, Uniqlo will donate scrap denim materials to ALKFI-BayaniJuan, a program that caters the community of Southville 7. The sewers of the community will conceptualize, design, and create new items out of the given materials which will be bought back by Uniqlo to be used as their corporate giveaways. The clothing brand will also provide trainings to the group to ensure a steady supply of skilled workers.

For the past five years, Uniqlo has been placing recycling boxes in each of their stores where customers can donate their clothes that they no longer want to use. The collected clothes will be donated to ALKFI, to be used by ALKFI's different program to their community outreach projects and other related activities.

Geraldine Sia, Uniqlo's General Manager beams, "What Uniqlo and ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation (have) in common, is we are able to provide dignity for people. Aside from that, particularly for this BayaniJuan project, is for us to equip women, for them to have this livelihood, for them to learn, and they themselves will also grow from this kind of work and training."

To date, Uniqlo has 24 stores where customers can bring the clothes they want to hand down. By donating, they also become a part of helping the community assisted by Lingkod Kapamilya.

A Brighter Sunshine in Southville 7

Since 2010, the partnership of ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation's BayaniJuan and Sun Life Financial has grown more than giving shelter to the residents of Southville 7. In 2010, Sun Life Financial committed PHP 49 million to help improve lives of families living in Southville 7, Calauan, Laguna. A portion of the donation amounting to PHP 9.69 million was used to build 114 Panibahay units for families that came from Estero de Pandacan and Estero de Paco in Manila. Sun Life also funded community facilities such as a community center, learning center, rainwater harvesters and water pumps. Moreover, it supported Itikan ni Inay – a small enterprise composed of 10 mothers involved in the production of salted duck eggs.

Sun Life's adopted community, also known as Legacy of Light Village was hit by Typhoon 'Glenda' in July 2014, destroying many of the Panibahay units, as well as the learning center and gymnasium. Despite the disaster, Legacy of Light residents showed solidarity with their neighbors by offering to adopt affected families until the houses were repaired. Other families, meanwhile, temporarily transferred to vacant units in Site 2, where they were welcomed by the Humanityville Homeowners Association.

Everything is Bright and Right

From a group of 10 mothers, Itikan ni Inay has expanded its operations to accommodate 20 more people. The original Itikan ni Inay group, together with Dr. Rene Santiago of the National Swine and Poultry Research Center, shared their know-how to raise ducks and to prepare salted ducks. The enterprise also transferred its duck farm from a rented property in Barangay Wakat to a bigger 1,000-sqm lot inside an Ayala-developed agricultural park. The new duck farm is now home to 1,300 ducks. Wilma Vibar, one of Itikan ni Inay's members, said they are also excited about producing balut using

ALKFI and Panibahay brainchild Architect Edgar Reformado revisited the design of the Panibahay to improve the structural integrity of the housing units. The modified design was applied in the reconstruction, which was completed in December 2015. The Alternative Learning Center, meanwhile, had minor repairs done in November 2014. Finally, the reconstruction of the Community Center will be finished in December this year.

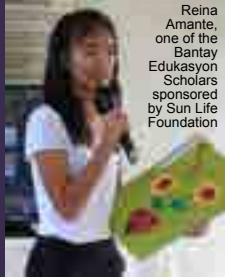

Perhaps, a Bit Easier



Access to medical care may be a challenge to families trying to make ends meet every day. An income that can only suffice the daily meals may only be just that, enough to put food in the table. 3 of the 5 children of Tatay Judy Millan are fortunate enough to be able to go to school as they try to have enough resources to feed every day. Especially now that they just welcomed their 5th child.

Tatay Judy, a security guard, helps his wife in raising their children; and attend to their needs as much as they can, like any parent would do. Two of their children, John Kenneth and Karla Mae, unfortunately suffers from different health problems. Karla Mae suffers from asthma while John Kenneth had to stop his schooling due to a health problem yet to be diagnosed.

John Kenneth was just 7 years old when he had his first attack during sleep. His body started to stiffen and shake uncontrollably. *"Na confine po siya sa ospital tapos, himihingan kami ng 100,000.00 pesos para mapag-aralan yung tagay niya kasi wala naman daw silang makita. Eh*

hindi naman po namin kaya yung halagang 'yon," Tatay Judy shares. (He was confined in the hospital and they were asking us for 100,000 pesos so they can examine my son. We cannot afford it.)

The seizure-like attack would usually start with a pain in the abdominal area. This condition results to a feeble body preventing Kenneth to do strenuous activities including playing games. He was an incoming 4th grader when the weakening of his extremities happened. This caused his hands to shake when holding a pen forcing his parents to take him out of school.

Tatay Judy's family is one of the 300 families who lined up in the outreach project held at Bancal Elementary School in Carmona, Cavite. It was the perfect timing for Kenneth to have a medical check up since it is one of the free services given during the outreach. Tatay Judy's daughter, Karla, was given medicine for her asthma; while Kenneth was given multivitamins and advised to seek help from a neurologist.



The outreach project was spearheaded by Bantay Bata 163 Laguna together with SC Johnson, Gardenia, and the LGU of Carmona, Cavite, in celebration of the 23rd National Children's Month. Aside from free Medical Consultations and medicines, the program also included free haircut, massage and dental consultations. Parents were given a Child Abuse Prevention Seminar while their kids enjoyed the games and performances prepared for the event. Each family went home with a special giveaway after the program.

For 18 years, Bantay Bata 163 has been all over the Philippines conducting community outreach projects. It may not be as much; but with the help of generous donors, Bantay Bata 163 hopes to make the lives of Filipino families, perhaps, a bit easier just like Tatay Judy's.

CARLES, ILOILO IS NOW BANTAY KALIKASAN'S ECOTOURISM SITE

At the northernmost tip of the Iloilo Province lies the municipality of Carles – an ensemble of beautiful islands surrounded with pristine beaches. It was an unknown wonder only appreciated by the lucky few.

Until ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc. and the local government of Carles, Iloilo collaborated to transform the municipality into the ranks of the top tourism destinations of the country and uplift the lives of the communities.

Carles, Iloilo Mayor Siegfredo Betita explained that while Carles boasts of natural wonders, the people remain poor. species of fish," Mayor Betita articulated.

ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc. (ALKFI) Chairman Gina Lopez shared that the fruition of this collaboration is the creation of Carles Development Council, which will involve the local government, Bantay Kalikasan and other stakeholders towards the development of Carles as an ecotourism site.

Lopez explained that one of the first projects for Carles is fish processing. She reiterated that the fisher folks should not practice dynamite fishing, and that she will purchase their produce through her G Stuff store.

Aside from the livelihood opportunities, Carles is also known for its picturesque sites like Gigantes and Sicogon islands plus its pristine clear beaches.

"So I want invite the public. Please come to Carles. Naku you can't imagine. Ang ganda ganda ng Carles. Like beautiful! Big shells, beautiful fish! It was really amazing glorious place. I've never seen anything like that," Lopez enthused.

A Demo Farm to Inspire Hope

Abner Flores, 31, and Raphael Batis, 20, are the two farmers who are maintaining a special 1,000-square-meter land at ABS-CBN's Eco Village in Iba, Zambales. This lot is a demo farm. It has a sustainable, year-round organic farm; planted with lettuce and carrots, herbs and spices such as Stevia, a natural sweetener, Rosemary and Oregano.

The farmers' planting method is a two-week cycle of Plant-Grow-Harvest. Every afternoon, they plant a row of seedlings; water the plants; and feed the pigs, chickens, and fish. After a day of work, they take a break inside their little "mud house" before going home. They harvest the produce every two weeks; then fertilize the plots with compost and vermiculture processed within the site, as well.

The construction of the demo farm showcases a sustainable farming method directly benefiting 20 people from its produce; which, includes Abner and Raphael. The latter shares, "Paede po kaming kumuha ng mga gulay dito sa farm para kainin." ("We can get vegetables from the farm which we then eat.") They no longer need to buy vegetables from the market; and the produce, being organically grown, is way healthier.

The demo farm in the Eco Village became possible with the partnership of ABS-CBN Lingkod Kapamilya Foundation, Inc. and Toshiba Information Equipment Philippines. Last June, TIP donated Pph500,000.00 for the planning, development and construction as

part of their corporate social responsibility project. Recently, its company heads visited the Eco Village to formally open the demo farm and turn it over to Abner and Raphael for daily care.

With the small-scale layout, the aim is for it to be a model farm to the residents of the ABS-CBN Eco Village. It demonstrates how they can also build their own mini farm in their backyards. It doesn't have to be as big; just smart. The vision is for each resident to have their own farm; thus, alleviating poverty in the community as it becomes a source of living. Abner sees the demo farm as a blessing since it now provides him a job and a source of living.

Abner and Raphael look forward to sharing their skills in farming with the other community residents; and help make their lives better, too.

December 2015, ALKFI plans to launch a feeding activity every Friday where the kids of Eco Village will be served with food from the demo farm.

The Village is a resettlement area for Mt. Pinatubo eruption survivors located in Brgy. Palanginan, Iba, Zambales.

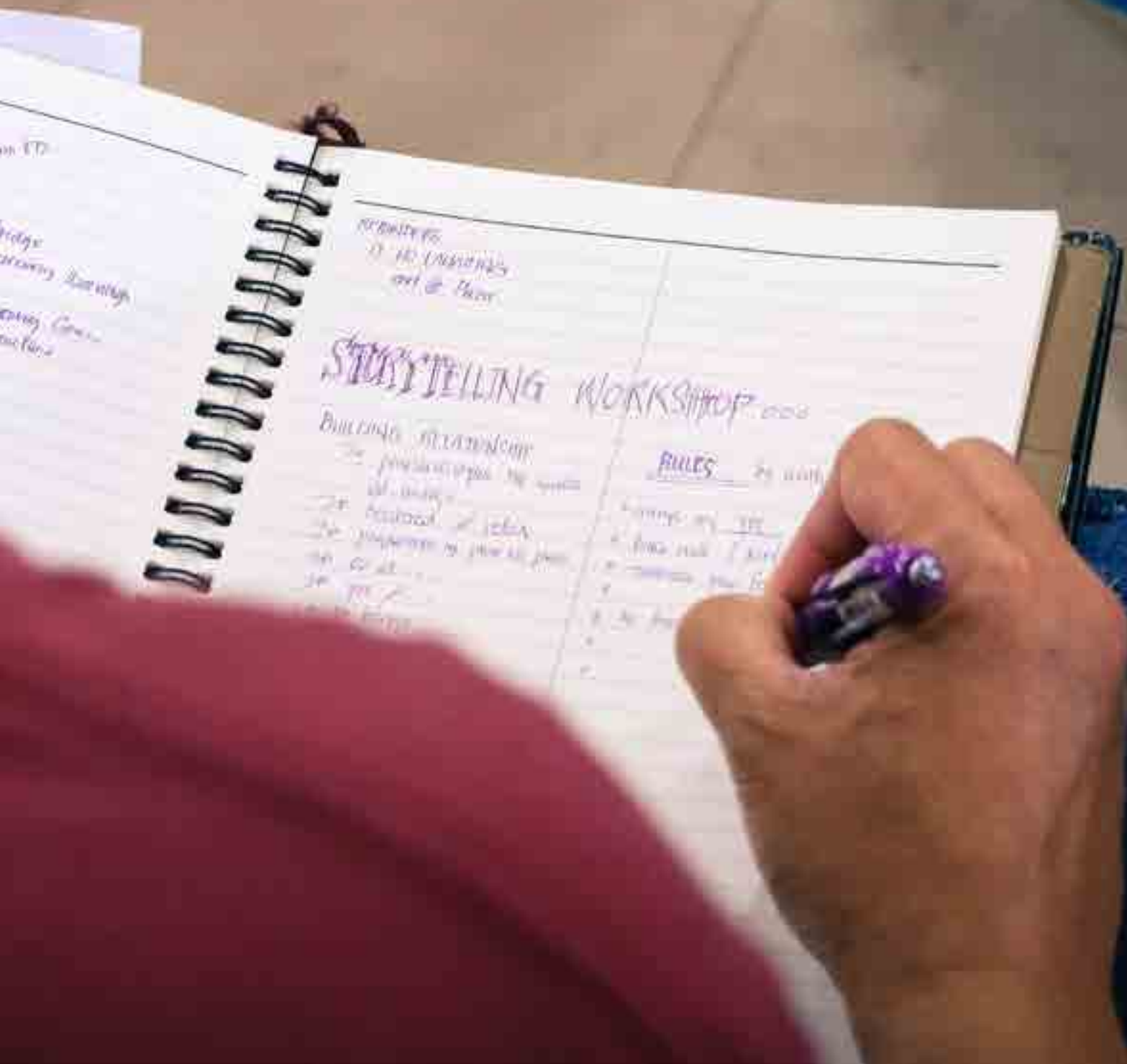
Hundreds of job seekers took the opportunity to find meaningful work during the 82nd DOLE Anniversary Trabaho Patrol on December 8, 2015 at the Abreeza Mall of Davao. Fifty-four local and twenty-one overseas employers participated in the event offering more than 21 thousand vacancies for call center agents, engineers, specialists, accounting staff, nurses, electricians, service crew and many more.

For the 22 year-old Liza Calzada, she was very thankful that in her first attempt to look for a job, she was among those hire on the spot (HOTS) as an administrative assistant for a local firm. A job which she says is a match to her qualifications.

Also among those hired on the spot was Junryl Bayaca, whose work experience as a scaffolder in a local company helped him to be hired by a firm based in New Zealand. Asked if he won't be homesick leaving his wife and four year old son behind, Junryl says it is for them that he will be working abroad.

From the 1,781 applicants interviewed, 94 were hired on the spot. But hopefully more will be hired from the almost 1,000 near hired applicants who will need to undergo further interview and examination. This project was in partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment Regional Office XI, Davao City PESO and Abreeza Mall under the Lingkod Kapamilya Trabaho Patrol of ABS-CBN Regional.
